Homework

Minute Maths

Children will be completing 'Minute Maths' several times a week. I will send copies home so that they can be practised if you wish.

Any other homework will be sent out on a Friday and returned by Wednesday. You are welcome to give me any feedback regarding this arrangement.

The Romans

We will be studying the Romans up until Christmas. Already, we have begun designing our Roman shields which we will be making and painting in the next few weeks. We are also planning a trip to Chester to learn a little more about what life was like for different groups of parts of society.

Reading

It would be very beneficial if you could set aside a few minutes each day to hear your child read.

With three little boys of my own, I know this can be a little stressful at times. However, it does have a big impact on your child's development. Ten minutes on most days will help enormously.

As soon as a book has been finished, sign the Reading Record and return it to school. There is a yellow box at the front of the classroom. I will send a new book home on the same day.

Guided reading takes place every week in small groups where the focus will be on understanding texts. I will also closely. monitor your child's progress through the reading scheme.

PE

PE is on a Monday morning; games is on a Tuesday

PE will be a mixture of gymnastics and dance which takes place in the hall. Indoor kits will be needed. For games, which is outdoors, there is no uniform as such so any weather appropriate clothing is fine.

SPELLINGS

Starting from next Friday, I will be sending spellings home to learn each week. These will be practised in class and then tested the following Wednesday. It would be great if you could set aside a little time each week to help your child learn them. This will be further supported Spelling Shed

LIBRARY

We will be visiting the library every week. Children are free to choose any book they wish and exchange it each week. I will let you all know our regular timeslot in the next few days
